Overview of FCDE:

Foundation for Community Development and Empowerment (FCDE) is a capacity building organization that works with 56 local partner organizations (LPOs), in 7 different sectors, in two districts in Western Uganda – Kasese and Rukungiri. FCDE delivers capacity building services to local organizations, such as providing technical trainings, resource mobilization support, and seed grants to implement projects. FCDE has been working in Kasese for 8 years, and Rukungiri for 4 years, and is continually growing the capacity to support CBOs in these communities.

The approach we take focuses on ensuring that organizations not only involve themselves in becoming more stable, but that they garner tools and skills to improve and strengthen the work they do on the ground.

Mission:


FCDE serves as a partner and catalyst building local organizations' capacity to drive positive and lasting community change.

FCDE's Impact

FCDE's main approaches to capacity building are through technical trainings, including one-onone support and training on assessed capacity gaps within the partner organization, as well as training workshops on various topics including grant writing, strategic planning, program design and management, project monitoring and evaluation (M&E), and communications and marketing. FCDE's Resource Center provides organizations with resources such as computers, internet, photocopying, printing, research, as well as receive computer trainings. FCDE also awards seed grants to our partner organizations for small scale projects, and through the support of writing proposals and submitting, and overseeing project implementation, our partners are able to grow their capacity to write and receive grants and mobilize resources. Between our Rukungiri and Kasese sites, our partners have been able to reach over 150,000 beneficiaries.

In 2018, data was collected from 53 of our of 56 partners, to assess the status and impact of the organizations as a result of FCDE support.

In 2018 there were:

- A total of 292 staff supported across 53 organizations
- 167 active programs (an average of 3 programs per organization)
- 57% of LPOs have formal external partnerships, 14% of which were aided by FCDE
- 17% of LPO staff have advanced computer skills

Resource Center:

• 6 out of the 9 resources utilized by 60% of our LPOs


Workshops and Trainings:

- 83% of LPOs attended a total of 95 workshops in 2018, 47% of which were FCDE workshops
- 28 LPOs attended workshops
- Most popular workshops were fundraising and grant writing, and marketing and communications

Greatest Need Assessed in LPOs:

The LPOs were assessed for their greatest need in terms of organizational support, and was determined that 79% was in fundraising, administration and management, and computer skills, all of which FCDE provides. The breakdown of the areas is:

Fundraising	31%
Administration and Management	25%
Computer Skills and Use	23%

LPO Grant Success:

FCDE provides support and trainings in writing grants to external funders by sending calls for proposals to the LPOs when there are new opportunities, and supporting in writing and submitting the grant to the funder.

- LPOs submitting external grants have a 29% success rate
- 38% of LPO grant submission to external funders were awarded

FCDE supported proposal writing for over half of all grant winning submissions, and technical support was provided to one third of the grants awarded.

This program in menstrual hygiene has enabled and supported three staff on full time employment where initially the organisation had only one staff. This has improved the lives of girls by enabling them to stay in school while accessing sanitary facilities."

2018 Impact in Kasese:

Of the 56 total partners, all 32 LPOs in Kasese renewed their contracts with FCDE in 2018.

Proposal and Resource Mobilization Support:

- 26 calls for proposals were shared to LPOs 69 times
- 56 grant proposals were supported to apply to external funders
- 9 external grants were awarded to 8 LPOs
- 10 LPOs applied for funding from FCDE, and 6 LPOs were awarded grants
- 2 LPOs successfully set up Global Giving accounts through FCDE for fundraising

FCDE followed up with and supported 9 partner organizations in the implementation of their grants

Capacity Building Plans:

FCDE met with all 32 Kasese organizations to assess organizational gaps and develop capacity building plans to address the gaps and improve organization structure and program implementation.

- 32 capacity building plans were developed with the LPOs
- By the end of 2018, 95% of all activities and tasks in the plans were accomplished. These included improving and developing HR, organizational policy, finance systems, M&E, communications, and documentation.

Resource Center:

- 39 staff trainings among 14 LPOs in computer skills and website building
- 80% trained are now able to use a computer at a basic level
- 60% trained can search on the internet, email, and use social media

Quote from participant of Resource Center computer training: "When I joined computer class at FCDE I knew nothing about the computer. I could ask the RCM [Resource Center Manager] or other users to help me open my organization email and help me open the incoming emails and respond. It was a big risk which I was taking since different people could have accessed the emails. Through the training given to me, today I can now, login to my email, read and write emails on my own"

Internship Partnerships:

Support from Global Health Corps Fellows

FCDE is partnered with Global Health Corps, where two fellows were hired to work with the LPOs on communications and advocacy, and M&E. In 2018:

- 3 LPOs were supported in implementing and improving M&E systems
- 8 LPOs were supported in developing communications and marketing strategies, creating promotional material, rebranding, and community outreach

2018 Impact in Rukungiri:

In Rukungiri, all 23 LPOs renewed their partnership contracts with FCDE. The Rukungiri office partners with Peace Corps to have one Peace Corps Volunteer to support staff and LPOs.

Proposal and Resource Mobilization Support:

- 19 external grant opportunities were shared with LPOs
- 15 proposals were supported and submitted to external funders
- 2 LPOs were awarded external grants from Peace Corps and USAID
- 2 LPOs were supported in implementing external grants
- 15 LPOs were supported in writing proposals for FCDE funding
- 10 LPOs were awarded FCDE funding, and all were supported in implementing projects
- 80% of FCDE funded projects were completed in 2018

Resource Center Support:

The FCDE Rukungiri Resource Center had an average of 50 users per month that were supported on printing, computer use, copying, internet use, computer trainings, and trainings in Microsoft office. New resources and materials were developed and used as tools that were shared with LPOs.

- 70% of LPOs utilized the Resource Center
- 40 staff trainings in computer skills were done
- 70% trained can now operate computers and use Microsoft office programs

Capacity Building Plans:

22 partners were supported in developing and implementing their capacity building plans with FCDE. The main gaps that were assessed across these organizations were M&E, communications and marketing, grant implementation and support, report writing, and strategic planning.

FCDE Intern Support:

Global Health Corps Support:

FCDE Strategic Plan:

In 2018, all FCDE staff members were involved in developing a new 3-year strategic plan for the organization. This strategic plan aims at reaching new objectives, expanding the scope of the work FCDE does in the two communities, and targeting strategies and approaches for higher impact.

The new approach to capacity building that FCDE is implementing is the Tier Support System. In which each partner organization is categorized into 3 tiers, depending on where they are at with organizational development in specific categories, and they can graduate to the next tier by reaching certain organizational milestones. This system was implemented in 2018 and will continue to be adapted into the FCDE capacity building strategy in the next 3 years.
